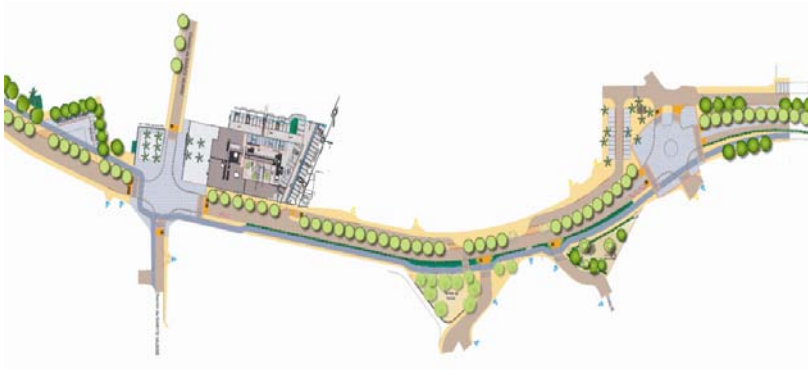

Context

Redevelopment of a peri-urban road in an area consisting of public buildings and facilities that revolves around the upcoming Sainte Musse park.

Aims of the project

Reduction of noise pollution (noise reducing asphalt).
Use of sustainable material for the development of pavements and cycle lanes.
Creation of speed tables across the road.
Parking space organisation, including some in side roads (122 spaces).
Functional and optimised public lighting.
Cosy atmosphere created with decorative lighting.
Landscaping.

Redevelopment and creation of piping and cabling networks.

Description of the project

The redevelopment of the boulevard is defined by its environment and the elements in its vicinity.
The morphology of the road enables fluid traffic flow and separation of uses and functions in side roads surrounded with vegetation.
The west side of the boulevard is particularly adapted to pedestrians thanks to a pleasant, shaded path and side roads to create a safe atmosphere for local residents and children.
The two-way cycle lane is isolated from the road and from pedestrian paths.
The landscaping, consisting of

lines of trees on the west side, is denser on the rest of the public space and integrates the forecourts of schools, the entrances of public facilities and various abandoned plots of land. The fact that vegetation has been added to private areas on the east side contributes to the redevelopment of the road and brings more consistency to it.
